

Guidelines for the Issuing of the NTNU Undergraduate Scholarship for International Students

1. The "Guidelines for the Issuing of the NTNU Undergraduate Scholarship for International Students" (below referred to as "the Guidelines") was created in accordance with governmental policy to expand recruitment of international students, and aims to promote academic internationalization by increasing the number of high-caliber, degree-seeking international students enrolled at NTNU.
2. The amount of this scholarship is NT\$10,000 per month per recipient.
3. The number of recipients for each year is calculated according to the formula below:
$$\text{Number of recipients for a given year} = \{\text{funds allocated by the MOE}\} / \text{NT\$10,000 (per recipient per month)} \times 12 \text{ months}$$
4. Eligibility:
 - A. Degree-seeking international students who have been admitted to the university are in their first year of study, and are not currently receiving any other Taiwanese scholarships are eligible to apply.
 - B. New students are favored during the selection process. Students who are currently enrolled and have come into financial difficulties must provide proof of their financial situation.
5. Award period: 12 months. Award payments are discontinued if the recipient takes a leave of absence or withdraws from the university.
6. How and When to Apply:

Apply for this scholarship while applying to the university (for degree-seeking students): check the appropriate box for this scholarship during the on-line application process. The application deadline for this scholarship is the same as

the deadline for applying to the university. The deadline date is posted each year in the prospectus¹.

7. Procedure for granting scholarships:
 - A. The number of scholarships allotted to each department is determined by the student recruitment committee during the first semester of the previous academic year.
 - B. Each department selects which of their students are to receive a scholarship and submits the relevant application materials to the Office of International Affairs, where the applications are processed and reported to the Ministry of Education for issuance of the scholarship.
8. Due to teaching related needs, some departments may require scholarship-receiving students to perform work. This is determined by each individual department.
9. These guidelines and their amendments will take effect on the date they are approved by the President.

¹The deadline for the Fall Semester is around March of each year. The deadline for the Spring Semester is around October of each year.
